## WELCOME

**TO WWT STEART MARSHES Year** orking in partnership with Environment What's happening here? Our coastline is constantly changing. WWT are working here to help form special new habitats for wildlife, improve flood management for local people, lock away carbon, support the local economy and provide an amazing place to visit for recreation and wellbeing.

As sea levels rise, earth and shingle banks protecting the peninsula become vulnerable to erosion and more difficult to maintain. Elsewhere on the Severn Estuary, important wetland

habitats are being lost.

of new flood banks, large areas of
saltmarsh are being created. Aerial
photographs help us to see how
quickly this is happening. Saltmarsh
locks away thousands of tonnes of
carbon every year, providing a long
term and sustainable solution to the

fight against climate change. The developing marsh, with shifting channels and creeks, also provides a vital refuge for wetland wildlife and is an important nursery for fish. In some areas, newly created fresh water grazing marshes, also important for wetland wildlife, are designed to help protect local properties from flooding by temporarily holding and storing water after heavy rain.

### WHAT TO SEE

Since 2014 when the tides started to wash over the land and the areas of freshwater began to develop there have been dramatic changes to this landscape. New plants and animals are now colonising the reserve and continue to do so in greater numbers with each passing year.

#### Highlights throughout the year

**Wetland walkway** Meandering paths take you through different habitats, over bridges, with 4 hides offering breathtaking views.

**Wide open landscape views** from the main observation points (marked on the map). Get all-round views of the Poldens, Mendips, Brecon Beacons, Exmoor and Quantocks.

**Breach point** It's up to an hour's walk from the car park – so make sure you see it at its best on a 'spring' high tide.

#### Wildlife highlights in summer

**Birds** such as little egret, avocet, swallow, yellow wagtail and skylark. Many **dragonflies** including black-tailed skimmer and emperor. **Plants** such as flowering rush and purple loosestrife.

#### Wildlife highlights in winter

**Birds** such as teal, wigeon, peregrine, meadow pipit and clouds of waders such as lapwing and golden plover moving over the marsh.



#### **Admission is FREE**

**Open all year round:** Take a short stroll or explore for a whole day on **foot, bike, wheelchair, or by horse** on the circular bridleway. Car parks and paths subject to a few local restrictions.

Hides, toilets and 2.1m height restriction barrier (main car park) Open daily 9am–4.30pm. 2.1m height restriction in place at all times at Steart Gate car park.

**Dogs** are welcome on most paths but must be kept under effective control at all times. **Please take all your rubbish** 

home with you and try not to disturb the animals and plants living here.

There are **hides**, **benches** and **viewpoints** around the site.

**Binoculars** are useful to bring to help you view the landscape.

**Tide times:** Only the highest tides enter the reserve, making an impressive spectacle. Check tide times via our website and noticeboard in the main car park.

**Fancy a cuppa?** There's no cafe on site, but it's an ideal picnic spot. To purchase refreshments, follow signs to the larger local villages and towns.
