Evening with the Swans 2025 FAQs

What is an Evening with the Swans event?

An Evening with the Swans event is a floodlit commentated swan and wild bird feed followed by an after-hours two course meal in the Kingfisher Kitchen.

Where does it happen?

The floodlit commentated feed takes place in our heated Peng Observatory which is adjacent to the Kingfisher Kitchen. The two course meal is served in the Kingfisher Kitchen.

When is it?

Evening with the Swans events is running on

2025: January 3rd, 4th, 10th, 11th, 17th, 18th, 24th, 25th, 31st

2025: February 1st, 7th, 8th

How do I book?

To book the Evening with the Swans event visit our website under the 'What's On' section.

What time does the event start and end?

We ask visitors to arrive for a 5:30pm start, the event will run until approximately 8.30pm.

Where do I meet for the event?

Please meet in the Swan café behind the Admissions desk at 5pm for canapes and bucks fizz (non-alcoholic alternatives will be available. If you are visiting Slimbridge for the event only, please enter via the shop by 5:00pm where you will be directed to the Admissions Desk to show your event ticket. If you are visiting us during the day, prior to the event, please note that normal admission charges apply.

How much is it?

Evening with the Swans tickets (including canapes and Bucks Fizz on arrival, commentated swan feed, and sit-down two course meal) cost £39.50 per person.

Is there a vegan or gluten free option?

Yes, there are vegan options and gluten free options for every course including canapés and dessert.

Is this event accessible?

Is the event suitable for children?

The event is generally suited to adults but some older children 12 + may be interested in the event if they have an interest in nature and the wild birds at Slimbridge. We do not offer a separate child menu. Please contact us if you intend on bringing anyone under the age of 18.

Do I need to wear warm clothes for the bird hide?

The Peng Observatory and Kingfisher Kitchen are heated. We do recommend that you bring warm clothes and wear suitable footwear for the walk to and from the observatory and car park.

Do you have to pay for parking?

Parking is free and we have 17 designated disabled spaces.

Will there be toilet facilities?

There are toilets just outside the Peng Observatory and in the main centre near the Kingfisher Kitchen. We also have a fully-equipped Changing Places facility on site at Slimbridge.

Is it table service?

Yes our catering staff will provide table service.
