Student Placement – Living Collections - Aviculture

Overview:

We're WWT, the charity for wetlands and wildlife. We're on a mission to restore wetlands because they are a wondrous solution to the problems our world faces. Together we will unlock their power – and help nature burst back to life. Because when wetlands flourish all life will flourish.

At WWT our people are instrumental, and we want to inspire future conservationists to help lead the way. This learning and development placement is designed to provide experience and skills development in the following areas:

- Practical animal care experience, in a wetland setting
- Experience of the workplace
- Wetland conservation.

You'll work within the Living Collections Aviculture team, developing practical animal care experience, and increase your animal behavior and welfare knowledge. The role will involve the day to day care of the birds in the collection, of rare and endangered species from around the world. You'll maintain and develop exhibits within the site, in order to improve welfare standards for our animals, and incubation and rearing of birds. As part of a BIAZA member zoological collection, this role is a great opportunity for someone looking for experience in animal or conservation based roles.

Responsibilities of the post

- 1. Assisting with the daily care and husbandry of the bird sections and avian breeding centre, including feeding, cleaning and enclosure maintenance.
- 2. Vital bird observation tasks and record keeping.
- 3. Assisting during the breeding, observing incubation and rearing of birds.
- 4. Assisting with bird handling and movements.
- 5. Help in administering health treatments.
- 6. Using training techniques to support the bird team in their work.
- 7. The potential for research experience.
- 8. The potential for experience in bird habitat and exhibit design.
- 9. Maintaining strict bio-security.
- 10. Interacting with visitors about WWT, our work and our vision and mission.
- 11. If you are required to carry out your own research project as part of your qualification, you will be supported to do so.
- 12. Any other tasks deemed reasonable.

Working at WWT

- 1. To work alongside volunteers encouraging, developing and supporting them in their work for WWT, ensuring that they have a positive volunteering experience.
- 2. Where appropriate, learning to and practicing supervising volunteer teams.
- 3. To be responsible for working within the WWT health and safety policy and guidelines ensuring that the health, safety and wellbeing of yourself and others is an integral part of how you work.
- 4. To be responsible for engaging with the WWT Sustainability Statement, being aware of negative environmental impacts and incorporating sustainable ways of working within your role.

1. Qualifications

Essential:

• Studying a relevant course which requires, or allows, a one year practical placement. Please note that this training placement is targetted at, and designed for, students. However, it is not essential that you are a current student.

2. Experience and skills

Desirable:

- Interested in practical animal care and habitat management, with some experience of a similar role.
- Understanding of bird welfare.
- Able to work in a team of staff and volunteers, and demonstrate good people skills.
- Proactive and able to carry out tasks with a minimum of supervision or independently under direction.
- Ability to follow instructions and safely complete activities.
- Public speaking skills.
- Ability to work outdoors in all weathers.
- Diving licence
